SPRINGFIELD, IL - August "Gus" Papili, 97, of Springfield, Ill., passed away peacefully on Feb. 4, 2017, at 3:35 a.m. in Quincy, Ill.

Born Oct. 2, 1919, in Newport, Penn., August was the son of Pietro and Rosa Morigi Papili. He married Carlinda Roke on Jan. 3, 1942.
