Culver resident Glen R. Breach died Oct. 27, 2008, at Aspen Court Assisted Living Center at the age of 83.

Mr. Breach was born Oct. 9, 1925, in Great Divide, Colo., to parents John and Frances Louise (Reagor) Breach. He moved with his family from Colorado to Idaho. After graduating from high school, he enlisted in the U.S. Army and served during World War II.

After the war, he worked awhile in Idaho, then in 1950, moved to Central Oregon, where he worked for Macy Farms and also for Ron Bergen.

On March 25, 1955, he and Isabelle Bergen were married at the original First Baptist Church in Madras. They worked a farm of their own for several years. After Mr. Breach retired, he continued to grow potatoes and corn. Several people would stop to buy his produce, and he always enjoyed visiting with them.

Mr. Breach was a member of the Madras Church of Christ. He enjoyed joking with people, playing checkers, fishing, camping, and loved children, who in turn, were taken with him.
