PACKARD, Russell "Rusty" J. Jr. of Saginaw, Michigan. Passed away Thursday, March 31, 2011 surrounded by family at the age of 85. He was much loved by his wife, children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren.

He was born March 15, 1926 to the late Russell and Ina Packard in Saginaw. He graduated from St. Joe's. He served in WW II 96th Infantry Division "Deadeyes," was wounded at Okinawa, and received the Purple Heart.
