## WORLD WAR II VETERAN MONROE COUNTY, MICHIGAN

Louis, age 88, was the son of Louis C. and Myrtle (Wehner) Sanglier. He was the husband of Elizabeth (Betty) Fountain. They were married on Nov. 27, 1943, in Monroe, Mi. Sadly, she preceded him in passing in March, 1997.

He lived in Lewiston, Mi. and passed away in Otsego Memorial Hospital, Gaylord, Mi. He was a former resident of Monroe, Mi. Friends called at Rupp Funeral Home in Monroe, and then services were held at the Green Funeral Home, in Lewiston, Mi. Burial was in Albert Township Cemetery, Lewiston.

After 30 years as a danley press operator for the Ford Motor Company, he retired in 1980. He also worked as a custodian for Peoples Federal Savings Bank, (now Bank of America) for 12 years and also worked for the Sealtest Dairy Company.
