Franklin P. Rose, 88, of Oak Harbor, Ohio, died Sunday, August 5, 2012 at the Ohio Veterans' Home, Sandusky, Ohio. He was born in Port Clinton, Ohio on June 13, 1924, a son of Albert & Mattie (Hemminger) Rose.

Frank was a U.S. Army veteran of World War II, serving in the 96th Infantry in the South Pacific. Wounded five times, he was the recipient of a Purple Heart with four clusters. He was also a member of American Legion Post #114, Oak Harbor. Frank moonlighted as a house painter and enjoyed hunting, trapping, and fishing.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, Betty J. (Chio) Rose on March 17, 1960; and his second wife, Shirley J. (Chio) Rose on October 31, 2010.
