Born in Elgin, Ill., Bob was a WWII Army veteran who received several medals, including a purple heart and a bronze star for his bravery in the Pacific War battles of Leyte and Okinawa.

He later moved to Portland where he married and worked as a self-employed watch repairman at the former downtown Lipmans and Frederick & Nelson department stores. He loved golfing, reading and traveling.

His favorite place to relax was under a palm tree on the island of Maui, Hawaii. He had a great sense of humor, positive attitude and was always "Terrific! When asked about his life, his response was I'm a lucky guy.

In his later years, he enjoyed participating in the Veterans Living History program by visiting area high schools and sharing his memories of the war.

A wonderful father and husband, he was preceded in death by his wife of 65 years, Mary Kruse Seiler; son, Tom; and granddaughter, Colleen. He is survived by his children, Lynn, David (Jill), Carol Silvey (Doug) and Jim (Steffanie); and eight grandchildren. A rosary will be recited at 10:30 a.m. followed by a funeral Mass at 11 a.m. Tuesday, May 24, 2016, at St. Cecilia Catholic Church in Beaverton.
